General introduction

Milestones

China participated at the Olympics for the first time in 1932, when it sent one athlete to the Summer Games in Los Angeles: Liu Changchun 劉長春 (1909-1983, m) took part in the 100 m preliminary on July 31, 1932 but failed to get a place in the Final of Men's 100 m. The first time an athlete from Greater China ever won an Olympic medal was when Maysang Kalimud (1933-2007, m)—a member of Taiwan's indigenous Amis tribe (*amei zu* 阿美族) competing for the ROC, also known under the Chinese name Yang Chuan-kwang 楊傳廣 [*Yang Chuanguang*] and nicknamed “Iron Man of Asia” (*Yazhou tieren* 亞洲鐵人)—grabbed silver in decathlon on Sept. 6, 1960 in Rome. The first gold medal for China in Summer Games was won in 1984 in Los Angeles. As for the Winter Games, China first participated in 1972 in Sapporo, won its first medal in 1992—Ye Qiaobo 葉喬波 (b. 1964, f) competing for China took silver in the 500 m event of women's speed skating on Feb. 10, 1992 in Albertville—and the first gold medal in 2002 in Salt Lake City.

Historical and political complications

Today, there are two states which use the word “China” in their official name: the Republic of China (ROC) and the People's Republic of China (PRC). The ROC, founded in 1912 and Asia's first republic, had a rough start, its first four decades marked by instability and civil war. The PRC was founded in 1949 after the victory of armies under the command of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) over the troops of the ROC government led by the Chinese Nationalist Party (KMT), the same year the ROC government retreated to Taiwan; the territory controlled by the ROC has been limited to the Taiwan area ever since. Until the 1990s both the ROC and the PRC claimed exclusive sovereignty over the greater China area (i. e. mainland China, Taiwan, and Hong Kong), the PRC still does so and regards Taiwan/the ROC as a ‘renegade province’ (*panlide yi sheng* 叛離的一省).

Taiwan had been a Japanese colony between 1895 and 1945, and after Japan's defeat at the end of WWII the island was placed under the control of the ROC according to decisions made by the Allies during the 1943 Conference of Cairo which were confirmed in the 1945 Potsdam Agreement. In the 1952 Peace Treaty between the ROC and Japan (*Zhong Ri heping tiaoyue* 中日和平條約) Japan formally gave up sovereignty over Taiwan.

Hong Kong became a British crown colony in the 19th century. In 1984 the PRC and the UK agreed on terms concerning Hong Kong's return to China, and Hong Kong became a Special Administrative Region (SAR) of the PRC in 1997.

As the ROC and the PRC do not recognize each other, both sides have been engaged in a fierce competition in the diplomatic arena. In 1971 the ROC withdrew from the United Nations in anticipation of the ROC's expulsion from the UN as decided in UN Resolution 2758. Since then the PRC has been recognized by dozens of countries. Unlike Germany or Korea which during their time of separation allow(ed) dual recognition, the ROC would break off relations with an ally if that ally recognized the PRC, and the PRC follows the same approach.

The turbulent history and rocky relations between the ROC and the PRC are reflected in the participation in the Olympics of the mentioned parties involved, and that political conflict has overshadowed the Olympic spirit of harmony and friendship for decades. In 1952, the ROC Olympic team withdrew in protest from the Summer Games in Helsinki because athletes from the PRC were allowed to compete; however, the PRC athletes were delayed and arrived only 10 days after the games began. The PRC boycotted the 1956 Summer Games in Melbourne because the ROC had been allowed to compete under the name “Formosa”. From 1960 to 1972, the ROC participated at the Olympics as “Republic of China”. Both the ROC and the PRC boycotted the 1976 Summer Games in Montreal over issues concerning the legitimacy of each other, and they were absent from the 1980 Summer Games in Moscow as well—the PRC due to the Sino-Soviet conflict which arose at the end of the 1950s, and the ROC because of the Cold War.

In November 1979 the IOC recognized the PRC as China's sole legal representative. Since 1984, the PRC has been participating at the Olympic Summer Games as “China” (*Zhongguo* 中國), and the ROC/Taiwan has been doing so as “Chinese Taipei” (*Zhonghua Taibei* 中華台北). According to IOC regulations which were adopted under pressure from the Chinese Communists, Taiwanese athletes are not allowed to compete under the name “ROC” or “Taiwan” any more. Furthermore, the ROC national flag has been banned at Olympic events and venues, the ROC

team is instead being forced to use a specially designed Chinese Taipei Olympic flag. Likewise, the ROC national anthem cannot be played to honour Taiwanese athletes who won an Olympic medal for their country.

Hong Kong has been sending athletes to the Olympics since 1952, missing only the 1980 Moscow Games, which it boycotted. After the handover, Hong Kong's team was called "Hong Kong, China" (*Zhongguo Xianggang* 中國香港).

Flags and gold medal count

Shown below are the five flags from Greater China that have been displayed at Olympic games, from left to right: Republic of China (officially used before 1976), "Chinese Taipei" (Olympic flag used since 1984), Hong Kong (before 1997), Hong Kong (since 1997), China (PRC, flown at the Olympics since 1984).



The number of gold medals won by athletes from the PRC at Olympic summer games is as follows—1984: 15; 1988: 5; 1992: 16; 1996: 16; 2000: 28; 2004: 32; 2008: 48; 2012: 39; 2016: 26; 2020: 38; 2024: 40. So far, athletes from Taiwan/ROC have won nine gold medals (2004: 2; 2008: 1; 2012: 1; 2016: 1; 2020: 2; 2024: 2), and the separate Hong Kong team garnered four gold medals (1996: 1; 2020: 1; 2024: 2). The PRC's gold medal yield at Olympic winter games—2002: 2; 2006: 2; 2010: 5; 2014: 3; 2018: 1; 2022: 9. Athletes from Taiwan/ROC and Hong Kong have so far failed to win any medals at Olympic winter games.

Please note that this file shows information about the regular Olympic summer and winter games only. Events like the paralympics, the deaflympics or others are not included here.

In 1954, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) had recognized the PRC's All-China Sports Federation (*Zhonghua quanguo tiyu zonghui* 中華全國體育總會, abbrev. *quanguo tizong* 全國體總 in Chinese and ACSF in English,

established on a congress in Beijing from June 20 to 24, 1952), but after the IOC allowed a team from Taiwan to participate in the 1956 Summer Olympics in Melbourne under the name “Formosa”, the PRC severed its relations with the IOC in 1958. The COC (*Zhongguo aolinpike weiyuanhui* 中國奧林匹克委員會, abbrev. *Zhongguo aoweihui* 中國奧委會; 卍—*zhuixi* 主席) was established after the IOC recognized the PRC as China’s sole legal representative on Nov. 26, 1979.

Before the establishment of the first Chinese Olympic Committee (*Zhongguo aolinpike yundonghui* 中國奧林匹克運動會, abbrev. *Zhongguo aohui* 中國奧會) in 1931, sports affairs and Olympic issues in particular were handled by the China National Amateur Athletic Federation (*Zhonghua yeyu yundong lianbehui* 中華業餘運動聯合會) which had been founded on April 3, 1922 and renamed to All-China Sports Federation (*Zhonghua quanguo tiyu xiejinhui* 中華全國體育協進會) on Aug. 24, 1924. Sources available online list Chang Po-ling 張伯苓 [*Zhang Boling*] (1876-1951, Tianjin), Thomas Chengting Wang 王正廷 [*Wang Zhengting*] (1882-1961, Zhejiang), and Hoh Gunsun 郝更生 [*Hao Gengsheng*] (1899-1976, Jiangsu) as the three chief executives between 1924 and 1955. It continued to exist as a separate entity after the establishment of the Taiwan’s Olympic committee, using the moniker “ROC Sports Federation” (*Zhonghua minguo tiyu yundong zonghui* 中華民國體育運動總會, abbrev. ROCSEF) since 1989.

After the 1945–1949 China Civil War, disputes over China’s legitimate representation at the Olympics erupted between the ROC and the PRC when the International Olympic Committee (IOC) allowed a team from Taiwan to participate in the 1956 Summer Olympics in Melbourne under the name “Formosa”. Following the ROC’s loss of its seat in the United Nations (UN) in 1971, the ROC’s national sports associations were reorganized by the ROC government in 1973. Since the IOC recognized the PRC as China’s sole legal representative in 1979, Taiwan’s Olympic committee has been forced to use the name “Chinese Taipei Olympic Committee” (*Zhonghua aolinpike weiyuanhui* 中華奧林匹克委員會, abbrev. *Zhonghua aohui* 中華奧會; 卍—*zhuixi* 主席).

SF&OC (*Zhongguo Xianggang tiyu xiehui ji aolinpike weiyuanhui* 中國香港體育協會暨奧林匹克委員會, abbrev. *Gang xie ji aoweihui* 港協暨奧委會; 卍—*huihang* 會長) was established on Nov. 24, 1950 under the name Amateur Athletic Federation of Hong Kong (*Xianggang yeyu tiyu xiehui* 香港業餘體育協會, abbrev. *Gangxie* 港協 in Chinese and AAFHK in English). In 1951 it was recognized by the IOC and renamed Amateur Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong (*Xianggang yeyu tiyu xiehui ji aolinpike weiyuanhui* 香港業餘體育協會暨奧林匹克委員會, abbrev. ASF&OC). Its current name was adopted on March 8, 1999.

Note: The 12th Olympic Summer Games were originally scheduled to be held in Tokyo 東京 in 1940 (Sept. 21–Oct. 6), but Tokyo lost its host status after the outbreak of the Sino-Japanese War in 1937, and the IOC then decided the 1940 Olympics to be staged in Helsinki (July 20–Aug. 4). However, after the outbreak of WWII in 1939 the 12th Olympiad was cancelled altogether. The 13th Olympic Summer Games, which were planned to take place in 1944 in London, were cancelled due to WWII as well. The 32nd Summer Games in Tokyo were originally scheduled to take place between July 24 and Aug. 9, 2020 but were postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic to July 23–Aug. 8, 2021.

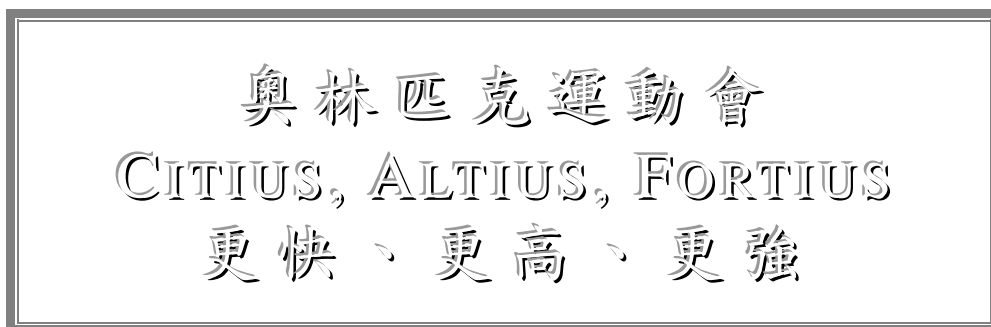
